1.0 Introduction

The AIA Commonwealth Scholarship is aimed at students who are committed to a career in accounting and finance. The scholarships are a life-changing opportunity to study for the AIA professional qualification with full funding towards online tuition, through AIA Achieve Academy, and exams fees.

There are five scholarship awards allocated for 2022. The scholarships are awarded for five years or until completion of the AIA professional qualification, whichever is sooner.

3.0 Funding

The funding covers:

- 100% of the associated costs of online tuition through AIA Achieve Academy and exams fees.
- All exemption costs, if applicable.
- First year membership fees on completion of the qualification and work experience requirements.

The funding does **not** cover:

- The AIA annual student subscription payable on 1 October each year.

3.1 Withdrawing from the qualification

If a student wishes to withdraw from the qualification before completion they must do so in writing and they will be asked to repay the scholarship, pro-rata.

AIA reserves the right to withdraw the scholarship if a student is found to be ineligible, does not make satisfactory progress on the programme of study or fails to sit consecutive exam sittings.

4.0 Eligibility

To be eligible for this scholarship you must meet the following criteria:

- Complete the scholarship application form including an essay of no more than 800 words in response to the questions listed. Submissions need to be in English.
- Meet AIA's entry requirements for registration as a student which are 2 A Level passes plus 3 GCSE passes (in five separate subjects including Maths and English) or equivalent.
- Hold an English language qualification of IELTS 6.5 or its equivalent, if your first language is not English.
- Be a national of any Commonwealth country, as listed [here](#), excluding the UK.
- Commit to undertaking the AIA professional qualification, online course of study and sit consecutive exam sittings in May and November each year.
- The application should be counter-signed by a sponsor who is 'a person of good standing in their community' or work in (or be retired from) a recognised profession.
