Part 1: Potential Tax Issues - Challenges faced by NGOs

The Inland Revenue Department's (IRD) approach to tax exemptions for charities has evolved recently. It's crucial for organizations to understand that a charity's tax-exempt status does not automatically shield all income from taxation. Profits from activities like property letting and investments may be subject to tax unless specific criteria are met.

The IRD's rigorous reviews of charities' tax exemption statuses indicate heightened scrutiny and less tolerance for non-compliance. Failure to meet the IRD's evolving requirements could result in tax liabilities, penalties and reputational damage.

Implementing robust strategies to manage tax risks is essential. In this seminar, our expert speaker will share practical insights on:

- The IRD's current review focus
- Common misconceptions about tax positions
- Effective solutions for charity-related tax issues
- Real-life case studies
